1.	Welcome and Introductions:	
	Councillor C Siddall welcomed everyone to the meeting.	
2.	Apologies for Absence, Declarations of Interest and Public Questions:	



Apologies for Absence:

An apology for absence was received from Ms L Hinman - Area Manager, North Essex Parking Partnership.

Declarations of Interest:

There were no interests declared.

Public Questions:

The meeting was not held in public, but the Chairman allowed two people to make statements, the details of which are set out below.

Also, the Chairman invited Councillor S Dedman, representing Finchingfield Parish Council, to attend the meeting. Councillor Dedman did not ask a question or make a statement.

Statement by Councillor J Cockell for Hatfield Peverel Parish Council

Councillor Cockell made reference to the following schemes which were listed within the 'Schemes Awaiting Funding' report (Agenda Item 6). Councillor Cockell explained that the schemes related to potential traffic calming measures in Hatfield Peverel and Nounsley.

LBRA212015 – Traffic management improvements (speed survey), Station Road/Terling Road, Hatfield Peverel (in validation)

Councillor Cockell stated that vehicles were driven at speeds in excess of 30mph in this area on a daily basis and to and from the railway station. The area was also used by pedestrians walking to and from the station. It was considered that the construction of 140 new dwellings on the former Arla dairy site would exacerbate the problem.

LBRA212022 - Traffic management improvements (speed survey), Church Road, Hatfield Peverel (validated and assessed to have a red RAG status due to a speed survey showing good compliance with the existing 30mph limit)

Councillor Cockell stated that the village schools were located between two, effectively blind, bends and permitted parking on one side of the road reduced the carriageway to one vehicle width. Pedestrians had to cross the road between parked cars, which meant that drivers of approaching vehicles had limited vision. It was considered that 20mph was an appropriate speed limit in the vicinity of a school.



LBRA212023 - Traffic management improvements (speed survey), Maldon Road, Hatfield Peverel (in validation) Councillor Cockell stated that there were six entrance roads to Hatfield Peverel and Nounsley and that many had 30mph speed limits starting from open countryside locations. However, it was considered that the existing restrictions should be reinforced as the roads led quickly into residential areas.

Councillor Cockell requested Essex County Council and Braintree District Council to assist Hatfield Peverel Parish Council in its effort to secure traffic calming and speed control by supporting the applications and to improve overall road safety for local residents.

The Chairman stated that a written response would be sent to Councillor D Louis, Essex County Councillor for Witham Southern Division regarding these matters.

Statement by Mr M Wood, Head Teacher of Elm Hall Primary School, Conrad Road, Witham

Mr Wood expressed concern about traffic, highway safety issues and vehicles being driven at unacceptable speeds in the vicinity of Elm Hall Primary School, Conrad Road, Witham. Mr Wood referred to a number of incidents in recent years when the safety of children, parents and staff had been put at risk. Mr Wood stated that parking in the area was hazardous and that if vehicles were parked on the grass verge pedestrians had to walk on the road. Problems were increasing due to new housing developments in the area. Mr Wood requested the introduction of traffic calming measures including a pedestrian crossing and a reduced speed limit. Mr Wood invited Members of the Highways Panel to visit the site to observe the problems.

The Chairman stated that a written response would be sent to Councillor R Playle, Essex County Councillor for Witham Northern Division regarding this matter.

3. Minutes:

The Minutes of the meeting of Braintree Local Highways Panel held on 27th January 2022 were approved as a correct record.

4. Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Meeting Held on 27th January 2022:

<u>Minute 6 - 'Schemes Awaiting Funding'</u> (New Process for Vehicle Activated Signs and/or Speed Indicator Devices)

Reference was made to previous discussions by Members of the Panel regarding the new process implemented by Essex Highways, which enabled Parish, Town and District Councils to request, purchase and erect Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) and/or Speed Indicator Devices (SID) under a licence arrangement. Any such requests would be determined by Essex County Council's Cabinet Member for Highways Maintenance and Sustainable Transport. Previously, the Local Highways Panel had considered such requests, but could only recommend them for approval if a speed survey had identified a significant speeding problem.

In response to a question by Councillor R van Dulken it was clarified that, if preferred, Councils could still ask the Panel to consider a VAS and/or SID request as previously.

<u>Minute 6 - 'Schemes Awaiting Funding'</u> (LBRA152064 - Signalised crossing, A131, Panners roundabout adj. to Hungry Horse Public House, Great Notley)

Reference was made to an issue raised by Councillor G Butland at the last meeting of the Panel regarding the status of scheme LBRA152064 - signalised crossing, A131, Panners roundabout adj. to Hungry Horse Public House, Great Notley and whether the scheme was to be processed as a project for possible capital funding, or via the Highways Panel. It had been agreed that Essex Highways Officers should investigate the current status of the scheme.

Councillor Butland was pleased to report that he had subsequently discussed the matter with Justin Styles, Design Manager, Essex Highways and Charlotte O'Connell, Highways (C O'Connell - HLO)



	Liaison Officer, Essex Highways, who were dealing with it and would be submitting a report.	
5.	Funded Schemes 2021/22:	
	Consideration was given to a report on the Panel's Funded Schemes for 2021/22, which had been recommended for approval. The report provided an update on the current position of all schemes in the 2021/22 programme of work.	
	Members of the Panel were reminded that funding of £407,789 had originally been allocated to Braintree Local Highways Panel for the year 2021/22. Subsequently, a further £200,000 had been allocated making a total of £607,789 available for expenditure in 2021/22.	
	It was reported that £399,500 of the Panel's budget had been allocated to various schemes within the programme of work and that £7,500 had been allocated specifically to safer roads schemes, making a total commitment of £407,000.	
	In discussing this Item, reference was made to scheme LBRA173006 – Zebra crossing, South of Stubbs Lane, Cressing Road, Braintree, which Councillor P Thorogood had agreed to cancel following the receipt of objections. Therefore, a sum of £81,000 was available for re-allocation and expenditure.	
	DECISION: That the report be noted and that the following scheme be removed from the report:-	
	LBRA173006 – Zebra crossing, South of Stubbs Lane, Cressing Road, Braintree Estimated Cost:- £81,000 Reason for Cancellation:- Decision by Councillor P Thorogood following the receipt of objections.	
6.	Schemes Awaiting Funding:	
	Consideration was given to a 'Schemes Awaiting Funding' report, which included details of requests received for funding from the Panel's budget.	
	Members of the Panel were advised that Essex County Council had allocated £407,600 to Braintree Local Highways Panel for the financial year 2022/23. It had also been agreed that additional funding of £200,000 should be allocated to the Panel, as in the previous financial year. The County Council had also agreed that casualty reduction schemes should be funded from a central fund derived from the budgets of each of the Local Highways Panels across the County. This would reduce the	



budget allocation for the Braintree Panel by £59,612. Sums of £100,000 additional funding and £177,594 re-profiled funding from 2021/22 remained available for expenditure. However, it was reported that five schemes which had been approved and designated for completion in 2021/22 had slipped to 2022/23. These schemes totalled £128,000 and were:

LBRA198001 - Creation of Public Right of Way, Church Road, Rivenhall

Estimated Cost:- £3,000

LBRA168003 - Public Right of Way improvements, Byway 43, Steeple Bumpstead Estimated Cost:- £45,500

LBRA173005 - Zebra crossing, outside Templars School, Cressing Road, Witham Estimated Cost:- £67,000

LBRA192048 - Road narrowing signage, Head Street, Halstead Estimated Cost:- £6,000

LBRA215002 - Echelon parking, Manor Street, Braintree Estimated Cost:- £6,500

Therefore, a total of £697,583 was available for expenditure by the Panel in 2022/23.

The total value of unallocated schemes on the potential schemes list was £351,500. In discussing these schemes, reference was made to an E-Mail which had been sent to Essex County Council Members of the Panel by Charlotte O'Connell indicating which of the schemes could be implemented. It was agreed that this E-Mail should be sent to Braintree District Council and BALC Members of the Panel too. Reference was also made to some typographical errors within the report and it was agreed that these should be amended. Councillors raised queries also regarding the schemes which had been transferred from the 2021/22 programme of work to the 2022/23 programme and Charlotte O'Connell agreed to contact these Councillors individually to provide the requisite information.

The Panel was advised that a number of schemes, including those which individual Members had identified as their top priorities, were still subject to validation and had not been included in the current 'Schemes Awaiting Funding' report. However, it was anticipated that an update on these schemes and any others submitted would be reported to the next meeting of the Panel.
