

# Public notice

## The Essex County Council (Various Roads, North Weald Bassett, Epping Forest and Harlow) (Combined Speed Limit) Order 202\*

**Notice is hereby given** that the Essex County Council proposes to make the above Order under Sections 84(1)(a) and (2) and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).

### Effect of the order:

**1. To implement:** a '40mph Speed Limit' (Currently a 60mph Speed Limit)

Road	Description
B181 Epping Road	From a point approximately 7 metres from the extended eastern kerb line of The Plain to a point approximately 64 metres north west of the eastern extended kerb line of Coopersale Common. For a total length of approximately 597 metres
Coopersale Common	From the junction of B181 Epping Road Southeast for approximately 218 metres

'Epping Forest District (B181 Epping Road, North Weald) (60 Miles Per Hour Speed Limit) Order 1992' and 'Epping Forest District (Coopersale Common) (30 Miles Per Hour Speed Limit) Order 1997' and 'The Essex County Council (Various Roads, North Weald Bassett) 40MPH Speed Limit) Order 2010' and 'The Essex County Council (Woodside, North Weald Bassett) (Restricted Road) Order 2013' and 'The Essex County Council (A414 London Road & London Road. District of Epping Forest & Harlow) (40MPH and 50MPH Speed Limit) Order 2017' are hereby revoked in their entirety however, all restrictions not shown above, shall continue in force by virtue of this new Order.
