30 Miles Per Hour Limit

From the existing 30 miles per hour limited area at a point fronting No. 8, Coopersale Common Road to a point 100m north west of the northern kerbline of the junction of Garnon Mead and Coopersale Common Road.

From the existing 30 miles per hour limited area at a point 25m south of the southerly kerbline of the entrance to The Vicarage, Coopersale Common Road to a point 90m south west of the southerly side of the entrance to St. Alban's Church, Houblons Hill.


Statement of Reasons for Making the Order


Epping Forest District Council acting as managing agent to Essex County Council has embarked upon a long term speed reduction strategy to improve road safety and reduce the occurrence of accidents. This accords with the County Council's Speed Reduction Policy. This Council's aim will be to reduce the speed of traffic to 30 mph or less within both rural and urban communities as an ongoing process over the period 1996-2001.

To support this initiative the Council recognises that to effectively reduce speed, appropriate traffic engineering measures should be introduced. The Council has allocated funding for a number of speed reduction schemes across the District during this financial year.

To achieve the Councils aims of reducing traffic speeds it is proposed to introduce a number of new features on the approach to both rural and urban areas. These include "gateway" signs together with coloured road surfacing, road markings and other signing improvements. The Council consider that this will increase driver awareness of the need to slow their speed in the designated area.

These proposals include the amendment of existing limits by the amendment of 30 mph zones at the urban boundary. This proposal will create a village envelope scheme in Coopersale Common.
