1.	Welcome and Introductions: Cllr Mrs Wagland welcomed all present.	
2.	Apologies for absence: Apologies had been received from Cllr Andy Fryd, Cllr Julie Morrissey and Cliff Poppy (BBC)	
3.	Minutes of previous meeting: The minutes of the meeting held on 28 June 2019 were agreed to be a correct record except that Cllr Jobbins was shown to have attended when he was absent.	
4.	Matters arising from minutes of previous meeting Cllr Aspinell advised that he had been made aware by Cllr Bentley that road planings were no longer to be used for bridleways and footpaths as they would be contaminated with oil, diesel etc from the roads. Regarding the Bakers Lane Children in Road signage – Cllr Cloke had not met with the engineer and DMcL on site but the correct location for the sign had been identified.	

	<p>Cllr Aspinell advised that the bus shelter planned to be installed in Danes Way, Pilgrims Hatch had not yet appeared. DMcL advised that following his site visit with Cllr Aspinell, this proposal was put forward for validation but at present, all Passenger Transport schemes/validations are on hold. This will be validated in the coming months.</p>	
<p>5.</p>	<p>Presentation on 20mph schemes: DMcL circulated an information pack which differentiated between ways that 20mph zones could be implemented.</p> <p>Cllr Aspinell advised that he had previously requested that Larchwood Gardens should have a 20mph speed limit but this had been rejected. Action: Cllr Aspinell to send details to DMcL and he would investigate possibilities.</p> <p>There was a discussion about Community Speedwatch which fell within the remit of BBC officer Dan Cannon. Action: DMcL to send a letter to Mr Cannon in the Chair's name to establish if the scheme was effective.</p> <p>SC described the 3PR scheme which rewarded children for walking to school. Cllr Cloke advised there were no such schemes in Brentwood as parents would not support them.</p> <p>Cllr Mrs McKinlay highlighted such a scheme might not be practicable for working parents.</p>	<p>BA/DMcL</p> <p>DMcL</p>
<p>6.</p>	<p>Report on Funded Schemes 2019/20</p> <p>Match Funded Schemes</p> <p>An update was provided on the current position of all the schemes Brentwood LHP had recommended for inclusion in the 2019/20 programme. There was no remaining budget to be allocated.</p> <p>Regarding item 4 – Hall Lane, Shenfield – Sharp bend & 20mph advisory signage, it was noted that signs had been erected and wig-wags would be installed in October 2019. Action: SC would pass on the Chair's concern that the wig-wags had taken such a long time to install.</p> <p>Regarding item 5 – High Street, Brentwood – footway improvements – it was noted that temporary slabs were in situ and that Conservation slabs would be swapped over as soon as they were in stock.</p>	<p>SC</p>

<p>Cllr Cloke advised that there was a quantity of the original slabs at Warley Depot. Cllr Kendall thought there should be supplies of all materials used when the High Street was renovated at the Depot. Action: Cllr Cloke would send an email to DMcL regarding these materials to ensure the contractors were aware of them.</p> <p>Cllr Wagland expressed concern at the many tripping accidents caused by paving slabs and thought tarmac may be safer as an alternative. Cllr Kendall and Cllr Aspinell advised of very dangerous areas of paving at Wilsons Corner and outside The Lot bar in Shenfield. Cllr Jobbins said that tarmac on footways in rural parishes had deteriorated badly.</p> <p>SC advised she was writing a report on expanding the remit of LHP's to include aesthetic schemes.</p>	<p>JC</p>
<p>Cllr Cloke advised that Basildon Council was using SEPP funds to effect footway improvements. Action: 1. Cllr McKinlay would circulate a photo of pressed tarmac which might prove a suitable alternative to paving. 2. <p>Regarding item 6 – Sawyers Hall Lane, Footway improvements – the feasibility study had identified improvements that could be made in relation to pedestrian safety. DMcL advised that there were a number of options including traffic slowing schemes and estimated costs for these were awaited. Cllr Aspinell's proposal of a subway had been passed to an engineer for consideration.</p>	
<p>Regarding item 9 – Wigley Bush Lane/Weald Road – improvements for pedestrian school access - it was anticipated that a contribution to the £92,500 cost might be made by St Peter's School. DMcL to liaise with Cllr Wagland Re. contacting the school.</p>	<p>DMcL/LW</p>

<p>Regarding item 9 – Sandpit Lane, South Weald – width restriction. Cllr Kendall expressed grave concern regarding the bad state of Sandpit Lane in view of the high level of traffic using the road. SC advised that highway Inspectors were keeping an eye on the state of the road. Action: Cllr Wagland intended to speak to an engineer about the Panel's concerns.</p>	<p>LW</p>
<p>Regarding item 10 – Rayleigh Road, Hutton – planters/bollards – Cllr McKinlay questioned why this simple scheme was to take so long to implement. DMcL advised that as this scheme was commissioned after the 2019/20 budget had already been</p>

Therefore, it would have to wait for consideration until the 2020/21 funding was available.</p> <p>It was noted that the proposed installation of railings outside Tesco's in Hanging Hill Lane would not be implemented as this would result in preventing access for wheelchairs.</p> <p>Schemes Awaiting Funding</p> <p>The list provided included scheme requests received for consideration by the Local Highways Panel. The estimated cost to implement all the proposed schemes was £402,500.</p> <p>Traffic Management</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pastoral Way/Osbourne Heights, Warley – junction markings – this had been undertaken by SEPP and could therefore be removed from the list. 2. Bakers Lane, Ingatestone – Pedestrian warning signage – the estimated cost was £4,000 and the scheme was feasible. 4. York Close, Shenfield – junction markings – Cllr Aspinell advised there was a question over the highway boundary. Shenfield Road to Shenfield – Cycle Route – the estimated cost of £239,500 was prohibitive and the feasibility study recommended a number of improvements and additions to the current cycle infrastructure including signage on existing roads. Action: DMcL would check out the available route via minor roads.</p> <p>Cllr McKinlay requested that consideration be given to implementing parking provisions in Kelvedon Close, Hutton on an area of dead land there. Action: Cllr McKinlay would liaise with DMcL regarding a possible scheme.</p> <p>Passenger Transport Cllr Aspinell advised that, according to the ECC website, three bus stops in Doddinghurst Road were to be replaced. In his opinion they did not need replacing and it would be a waste of money.
