## **Definitive Map and Statement for the County of Essex**

## **The Essex County Council Definitive Map Modification No. 699**

## **Footpath 26 Wivenhoe (Colchester City) Order 2023**

The above Order made on 22 June 2023, if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map for the area by:-

Adding a length of public footpath numbered 26 Wivenhoe, from the northern end of Paget Road South, (Point A on the order plan) in a north westerly direction for a distance of 18 metres to Point B at the south of the railway track. The width of this section of the way is 1 metre. From Point B the route heads north over the railway track for a distance of 11 metres to Point C on the order plan. The width of this section of the way is 1.75 metres. The route then heads north-east for a distance of 19 metres to reach Point D at the southern end of Paget Road South. The width of this section is 1 metre. From here the route follows Paget Road South, heading north for a distance of 59 metres to meet Queens Road at point E. The width of this section of the route is 2.75 metres. The route is subject to such stiles or gates as the railway operator is required to erect and maintain, as stipulated by legislation, from time to time.

A copy of the Order and the Order map may be seen free of charge during normal office hours at the Chelmsford Library, Market Road, where copies will be available on request at a charge. Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to the Director for Essex Legal Services, Essex County Council, Seax House, Victoria Road South, Chelmsford, Essex, CM1 1QH, to arrive not later than 12 October 2023 and it is requested that the grounds on which it is made are stated.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Essex County Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, may itself confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, any representations or objections, which have been duly made and not withdrawn, will be sent with it.
