| 1 | Chairman's Welcome   | Action        |

# Publicity and Member Balance

Katherine was concerned that they were supposed to have councilors as members, and there were currently no County Councilors or District Councilors, which would be a task for the new Chairperson to take on.

It was believed that there had been councilors in previous meetings, but they had never consistently joined in with all the meetings or remained members of the LAF.

Katherine highlighted that there used to be an NFU member however, there had not yet been a replacement for them. It was noted that Sam Iddison as a member represents landowners.

There used to be an annual report that needed to be completed for Natural England, which had not been required for several years, and Katherine noted that this may raise the group profile if it were to be brought back.

It was confirmed that the group no longer had a cycling representative however, there were multiple members with cycling connections. **Geoff Fletcher mentioned he could talk to cycling UK representatives to see if one of them could join.** 

Geoff added that Cycling UK have completed a lot of work relating to developing long distance cycle routes. Katherine confirmed that it would be good to speak with representatives at Cycling UK.

Katherine informed that Sustrans have been invited to PROW User Group meetings in the past however, they have not attended a meeting since Sandra Reynolds left Sustrans. Geoff believed that Sustrans do not have a Local Rep now.

# 2 Minutes of the previous meeting held on 14th May 2024 and matters arising.

Shirley shared her screen with the meeting, which had the amendments made by Katherine to the previous minutes.

There were various dates that were changed to this section of the minutes.

# Section 4: Ramblers Accessibility Fund.

Rowena wanted to update professionals around the Ramblers Accessibility Fund, as the money had recently been registered into an ECC account and the work was set to commence imminently, which was not ideal because of winter. There had been correspondence back from the head of the Ramblers Accessibility Fund, who suggested that there may be money left over to explore other opportunities.

There were questions around replacing kissing gates, and Katherine believed that it was the landowners responsibility to replace these gates. Shirley confirmed that structures such as gates are the responsibility of the landowner to install and maintain. The highway authority will become involved if they become unsafe to use and can also become involved if they are not legal structures. Shirley mentioned that there were cases when the kissing gates were able to remain however, the landowners would be encouraged to replace them.

Rowena mentioned that Salary Brook Valley would become part of the garden community. There was funding ready for this however, the landowner was denying any work to be done on his land. Shirley suggested talking to the landowner to gain an understanding as to why he was refusing to have any work done.

## Section 5: National Grid

John mentioned that the construction of this project would be done primarily with pylons. John noted that he had done research around the sea route, and he discovered that this was not a normal process in shallow seas.

# Section 7: Costal Path Inclusive access guides update.

There were no changes to this section.

All of the attendees were now happy with the amended minutes.

## Matters Arisina

Rowena noted that an action point from the last meeting was to create alternative text for the PDF she shared, and to look at the slide format that Shirley's team wanted to use. Shirley presented the access guide and mentioned that there needed to be special text added in for people with visual impairments.

Rowena highlighted that she e-mailed Shirley to clarify whether the text Rowena had written under the pictures in her PDF would be replaced by the alternative text however, Rowena did not receive a reply.

Rowena mentioned that Shirley sent her a link to the software that was being used however, once Rowena opened the link for this software, she was unable to identify the template that ECC used.

Shirley mentioned that the PDF was unable to be fully launched until the alternative text was written. Shirley was not familiar with the Web Creator Page software, which made it difficult for her to complete the slides.

Katherine advised to pause any action around creating the slides on the Web Creator page, and instead Rowena should finish creating descriptions of the photographs for the PDF, as additional text. Once this extra work is complete by Rowena, the PDF would be ready to upload onto the website.

## 3 A1023 Brentwood Walking and Cycling Scheme public Consultation.

Geoff received an e-mail from Gareth Burton.

Geoff mentioned the issue was that the path would be a shared path, and non-segregated, which could be an issue, as it was on a steep 4-5% downhill gradient.

There was a counter proposal to Highways around the central lane, which was minimally used. It was questioned whether this lane could be converted to a cycle lane however, Highways believed this could cause congestion.

Katherine agreed with the need to have a separate cycle lane, and there should be no reason for a shared cycle foot lane.

Geoff mentioned that there were certain parts of the road, where there was not much of an issue with a shared footpath.

## 4 Sunshine Coast Greenway project.

This was always intended to be a multiuser route because it was defined as being two routes around the peninsula. The idea was to join up various towns with accessible routes, shared paths, and separate paths for cyclists and pedestrians.

This project was at the point for defining the optimum cycle and walking paths, as well as the need for funds. This project was estimated to need £500,000 to complete the 95-kilometre route.

Katherine informed that ELAF do not have any funds however, the Norfolk LAF have set up a separate charitable arm. The charitable arm needed a project in order to be set up.

Jan questioned whether the multiuser group included horse riders, which it did not. It was mentioned that the path would be ruined if horses were allowed on, and this would ruin the path for cyclists and pedestrians.

Geoff Fletcher mentioned that landfill companies usually have funding available, but they would not be able to fund the full £500,000.

Katherine highlighted that because this project was based around the tendering peninsula, which is supposed to be a deprived area in England, there would be funding from the Essex County Council available.

Rowena mentioned that the LDP funding was coming to an end, and it will be replaced by a new funding round, which may provide help for Sunshine Coast Greenway project.

The Tendering District Council got their first draft strategy, which Sunshine Coast Greenway project is a part of. The District Council have funding and they were intrigued with this project.

Shirley was interested to see the route for the Sunshine Coast Greenway project, and Shirley mentioned that she can provide updates around the England Coast Path Scheme.

It was mentioned that Rick would provide help outside of the meeting, around how to access commute.

Shirley mentioned that on the website, there is no ownership to say who the organisation is, which would be useful to have to gain recognition from other organisations.
