NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2020 FOOTPATH 1 NAZEING IN THE DISTRICT OF EPPING FOREST

On 19 August 2020 Essex County Council confirmed the above order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert a part length of Footpath 1 commencing from a point approximately 100 metres south east of Nursery Road on the south eastern side of the garden hedge/fence of the property known as Naivette EN9 2JQ (grid ref: 53895,20677), proceeding generally south westward through the trees/hedge on the northern side of the fence to a point on the southern side of the Naivette fence approximately 15 metres further south west at grid ref: 53894,20676, to an alternative route commencing at the aforementioned point on the south eastern side of the Naivette garden hedge/fence, running in a south westward direction for a distance of approximately 14 metres on the southern side of the Naivette garden hedge/fence to re-join the existing unaffected path as shown on the order map.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map can be requested to be posted or viewed by emailing publicpathorders@essexhighways.org quoting the order title to arrange a suitable time to inspect the documents. Documents can be made available for inspection 8.30am-4.30pm Monday to Friday at Essex County Council Offices, County Hall, E block main reception, Market Road, Chelmsford if so required, following the current social distancing restrictions. The order comes into force on 17 September 2020, but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 10 September 2020 make an application to the High Court.
