NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2020 FOOTPATH 28 ALPHAMSTONE DISTRICT OF BRAINTREE

On 08 July 2020, Essex County Council confirmed the above order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert a part length of Footpath 28 Alphamstone commencing from grid reference 58734,23474 where it connects to the highway known as Pebmarsh Road and running in a south easterly then south south easterly direction for a distance of 131 metres to grid reference 58739,23462, to an alternative route commencing at grid reference 58729,23466 where it connects to the Pebmarsh Road and running in an east south easterly direction across the field for a distance of 106 metres to the same above point where it continues unaffected as shown on the order map.

Documents can be made available for inspection 8.30am-5.30pm Mon-Thurs and 8.30am-5pm on Friday at Essex County Council, County Hall, E Block main reception, Market Road, Chelmsford if so required following the current social distancing restrictions. The alternative route comes into force on 06 August 2020, and the old route shall be stopped up with effect from 13 August 2020, but If a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 23 July 2020 make an application to the High Court.
