PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2024
FOOTPATH 65 SIBLE HEDINGHAM**

The above order, made on 9 July 2024, under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 as shown by a bold continuous line on the order map will divert a part length of Footpath 65 Sible Hedingham of unknown width shown by a bold continuous line on the order map commencing from a point at grid reference 57842,23275 in a north westerly direction through a gate into a paddock then in a generally south westerly direction through another gate and along a tree lined path with a natural surface then continuing to follow the western boundary of the property known as Mount Nesbo for a total distance of approximately 356 metres where it continues unaffected to a footpath being 2 metres in width shown by a bold broken line on the order map commencing at the aforementioned point in a south westerly direction along a private access road for a distance of approximately 339 metres then continuing in a north westerly direction along a natural surfaced path for a final distance of approximately 60 metres where it continues unaffected.

Notice of Making of an Order Highways Act 1980 Public Path Diversion Order 2024 Footpaths 15 & 22 Gosfield

The above order made on 16 July 2024 under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, as shown on the order map will divert:

Footpath 15
A part length of Footpath 15 Gosfield of unknown width shown by a bold continuous line on the order map commencing from a point just north of the watercourse heading in a southerly direction across an existing footbridge over the watercourse and across the corner of an agricultural field before continuing in a southerly direction along a surfaced farm track towards Aylewards Farm then continuing in a southerly direction through the farmyard. The path then continues in a south easterly then north easterly direction along the southern side of a field edge for a total distance of approximately 814 metres where it continues unaffected to an alternative route 2 metres in width shown as a bold broken line on the order map commencing from a point east of Aylewards Farm running in a north east direction following an uncultivated grass strip across the agricultural field and over the new footbridge for a total distance of approximately 446 metres where it continues unaffected.

Footpath 22
A part length of Footpath 22 Gosfield of unknown width shown by a bold continuous line on the order map commencing at its junction with Footpath 15 Gosfield running in a south easterly direction across an agricultural field for a total distance of approximately 530 metres where it continues unaffected to an alternative route 2 metres in width shown by a bold broken line on the order map commencing at the aforementioned point just north of the watercourse running in an easterly direction along a headland approximately 10 metres from the edge of the watercourse then continuing in a north easterly direction along the western and northern boundary of the sewage works for a total distance of approximately 590 metres where it continues unaffected.

(School Road, Little Maplestead) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic & Temporary Introduction of a Clearway) Order 2024

Notice is hereby given that the Essex County Council intends, not less than seven days from the date of this notice, to make the above Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Effect of the order:

1. To temporarily close that length of School Road, Little Maplestead in the District of Braintree, from its junction with Oak Road to its junction with Sudbury Road a distance of approximately 660m.
2. To temporarily introduce a 'No Waiting, No Loading and No Stopping' Restriction in the above length of road for the duration of the closure only.

"The Essex County Council (Braintree District) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Stopping) and (On Street Parking Places) (Civil Enforcement Area) Consolidation Order 2019" will be temporarily amended to include the temporary 'No Waiting, No Loading and No Stopping at Any Time' restriction and suspend any existing parking and waiting restrictions on the above lengths of roads only. All other restrictions and exemptions contained in the aforementioned Order and Amendments to that Order shall remain in force.

The closure/restriction is scheduled to commence on 2nd September 2024 for 5 days, or where stated on a valid permit (EP201EH2369301 - Essex County Council). The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signs showing and/or displayed on one.network. The closure/restriction is required for the safety of the public and workforce while gully cleaning, jetting and survey works are undertaken by Essex County Council.

An alternative route is available via Sudbury Road, Cock Road, Oak Road and vice versa. The Order will come into effect on 15th August 2024 and may continue in force for 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier.

(Boley Road, White Colne) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2024

Notice is hereby given that the Essex County Council has made the above Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Effect of the order: To temporarily close that length of Boley Road, White Colne in the District of Braintree, from its junction with Tyburn Hill for a distance of approximately 30m in a north westerly direction. The closure is scheduled to commence on 23rd August 2024 for 1 day, or where stated on a valid permit (AD03064263831 - Anglian Water). The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signs showing and/or displayed on one.network. The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while meter exchange works are undertaken by Anglian Water.

An alternative route is available via Colchester Road, Bures Road and vice versa (with access only into Boley Road).

The Order came into effect on 1st August 2024 and may continue in force for 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier.

(Bures Road, White Colne) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2024

Notice is hereby given that the Essex County Council has made the above Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Effect of the order: To temporarily close that length of Bures Road, White Colne in the District of Braintree, from a point approximately 820m south west of its junction with Ravensfield Farm Road for a distance of approximately 285m in a south westerly direction. The closure is scheduled to commence on 20th August 2024 for 1 day, or where stated on a valid permit (BC008PTMS482591 - Openreach). The scheduled dates may vary for these works with appropriate signs showing and/or displayed on one.network. The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while pole testing works are undertaken by Openreach.

An alternative route is available via Bures Road, Colne Road, Hornes Green Road, Peyton Hall Road, Bures Road, Pebmarsh Road, Cross End, The Street, Hill House Road, Cricks Road, Countess Cross, Lawshall's Hill, Colne Park Road, Colchester Road, Bures Road and vice versa.

The Order came into effect on 1st August 2024 and may continue in force for 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier.

(Various Roads, District of Braintree) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic & Temporary Introduction of a Clearway) Order (No.11) 2024

Notice is hereby given that the Essex County Council has made the above Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Effect of the order:

1. To temporarily close that length of road in the District of Braintree as specified in the schedule.
2. A temporary 'No Waiting, No Loading and No Stopping' restriction will be introduced on both sides of the carriageway on that length of road in the schedule for the duration of the closure to facilitate the works. Signs will be installed indicating when the No Waiting, No Loading and No Stopping restrictions will be in force.

"The Essex County Council (Braintree District) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Stopping) and (On Street Parking Places) (Civil Enforcement Area) Consolidation Order 2019" will be temporarily amended to include the temporary 'No Waiting at Any Time' restriction and suspend any existing parking and waiting restrictions on the above lengths of roads only. All other restrictions and exemptions contained in the aforementioned Order and Amendments to that Order shall remain in force.

The works being undertaken will take place within an 18-month period from 1st August 2024, exact dates will be specified on One.network. The roads will be closed to facilitate each phase of works and then re-opened to the public. Access will be maintained for emergency services. Diversion routes will be signed at each location and residents will be informed of the dates of each phase via letter/leaflet drop and advanced warning signs on the road.
