**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF ORDER  
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980  
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER  
BRIDLEWAY 32 ALPHAMSTONE DISTRICT OF BRAINTREE**

On 24/05/2023 The Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed with modifications the above-mentioned order under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert a part length of Bridleway 32 Alphamstone commencing from a point to the south of Clees Hall buildings on the access track bend at grid reference 58813,23437 postcode CO8 5DZ, running in a generally west north-westward direction along the existing track for a distance of approximately 160 metres where it connects to the lane at the gateway entrance, to an alternative path commencing at the same aforementioned point proceeding initially south south-westward for a distance of approximately 12 metres then west north-westward along the field boundary for a further distance of approximately 246 metres where it connects to the lane west of Clees Hall, as shown on the order map.

The order comes into force on the date on which Essex County Council as the Highway Authority certify that Articles 1 and 2 have been complied with, but If a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 13/07/2023 make an application to the High Court.
