

**The Essex County Council (Various Roads), (Channels Development,
Broomfield), Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 20***

The Essex County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to 2(4), 3(2) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III to Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. In this Order
"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act of 1984.
2. This Order shall be cited as The Essex County Council (Channels Development), Broomfield (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 20** and shall come into operation on *****.
3. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed in the said lengths of roads, Channels Development, Broomfield in the City of Chelmsford as specified in Schedule 1 to this order.
4. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing any motor vehicle to proceed in the length of roads specified in that Article if the motor vehicle:-

(a) is being used for fire and rescue, police or ambulance purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion;
6. The Council are satisfied that for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road to which the order relates or any other road, it is requisite that Section 3(1) of the 1984 Act should not apply in relation to this Order.
