

**The Essex County Council (A133 Clacton Road (Central Reservation Closure) Traffic Regulation Order 202\***

Essex County Council, (hereinafter referred to as "The Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and 2(1) to 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation in accordance with the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on \*\*\*\*\* and may be cited as The Essex County Council (A133 Clacton Road (Central Reservation Closure) Traffic Regulation Order 202\*.
2. No person shall cause any vehicle travelling on the A133 Clacton Road to use the central reservations as specified in the schedule to this order.
3. The restriction imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

## Prohibition of Traffic (Through Gap on Central Reservation)

<b>Road</b>	<b>Direction</b>
A133 Clacton Road	The gap on the central reservation is approximately 130 metres east from the centre of Loverose Lane east for approximately 10 metres.
A133 Clacton Road	From a point in line with the extended western kerb line of Elmstead Road east for approximately 10 metres.

**Note:** Vehicle Restraint System will close the gaps

**The Essex County Council (Turnip Lodge Lane Bridleway)  
(Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 202\* (Except for Cycles)**

The Essex County Council (“the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III to Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. In this Order  
“2016 Regulations” means The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.  
“motor vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act.  
“pedal cycle” has the same meaning as in the 2016 Regulations.  
“vehicle” meaning any motor vehicle, pedal cycle or horse-drawn vehicle.
2. This Order shall be cited as The Essex County Council (Turnip Lodge Lane Bridleway) (Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 202\* and shall come into operation on

3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall cause any vehicle (Except pedal cycle) to proceed in that length of Turnip Lodge Lane Bridleway, Elmstead in the District of Tendring, as described in the schedule to this order
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing any motor vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in that Article if the vehicle:-
  - (a) is being used for fire and rescue, police or ambulance purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion;
  - (b) is being used in connection with any of the following operations to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the said length of road, namely:-
    - (i) building or demolition;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of those lengths of road;
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road, of any sewer, or any main, pipe of apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity, or any telegraphic line; or
  - (c) is being used in the service of or contracted to a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
  - (d) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop, or is obliged to do so to avoid an accident, or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his/her control.

5. The Council are satisfied that for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road to which the order relates or any other road, it is requisite that Section 3(1) of the Act should not apply in relation to this Order.

Turnip Lodge Lane Bridleway	(i) From a point approximately 237.5 metres north-east of the north eastern edge of the Toucan Crossing Point north east for approximately 23 metres. (ii) From a point approximately 5 metres south east of Turnip Lodge Lane, south east for approximately 16 metres to the south eastern side of the A1331 Pegasus Crossing Northbound Lanes. (iii) From the southeastern side of the A1331 Pegasus Crossing Southbound Lanes south east then north east, then south east for approximately 65 metres.

**The Essex County Council (Turnip Lodge Lane) (Tendring District)  
(Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 202\***

The Essex County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 (1), 2( 1) to (3), 3(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") (as amended) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III to Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

1. In this order

"Taxi" shall have the same meaning as given in Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 Part 2, Schedule 1.

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the meaning given to it in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a vehicle lawfully displaying  
(i) in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge or  
(ii) a Recognised Badge.

"Pedal cycle" shall have the same meaning as given in Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 Part 2, Schedule 1.

"Motorcycle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle not being an invalid carriage with less than four wheels and the weight of which unladen does not exceed 410 kilograms, as defined in Section 136(4) of the Act of 1984.

"Motor vehicle" shall have the same meaning as given in Section 136 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"2016 Regulations" means The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.

"Goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, or a trailer so constructed or adapted, or an "articulated vehicle" within the meaning of Section 138 of the Act

"Business employee or owner" means an employee or owner of any business located at premises in the roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

"Goods" includes postal packets of any description "dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 6 to the Act

"Passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriageway) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer

"Resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

"Council" means Colchester City Council

2. Save as provided in Article 3 no person shall cause or permit a motor vehicle to be in that length of Turnip Lodge Lane from its junction with Loverose Lane south-east then north-east for approximately 595 metres (where bollards will end access) (hereinafter referred to as "the said length of road") as specified in the Schedule to this order.
3. Nothing in Article 2, of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing any motor vehicle to be in "the said length of road" during the specified times in that article if the vehicle: -
  - (a) Is being used for the conveyance of persons, goods, or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to "the said lengths of road".
  - (b) Is being used for fire brigade, police, or ambulance purposes.
  - (c) Is being used in connection with any of the following operations, namely: -
    - (i) Building or demolition operational.
    - (ii) The removal of any obstruction to traffic.
    - (iii) The maintenance, improvement, or reconstruction of those lengths of road.
    - (iv) The laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or on land adjacent to those lengths of road, of any sewer, or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity, or any telegraphic line.
  - (d) Is being used in the service of or contracted to a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
  - (e) In any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or is obliged to do so to avoid an accident or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control.
  - (f) Is a Disabled persons vehicle.
  - (g) Is a Licensed Taxi/Licensed Private Hire vehicle.
  - (h) Is accessing premises adjacent to, or accessible from and only from "the said length of road".
  - (i) Being used for any of the following purposes, but for so long only as is required to enable the vehicle to be so used.
    - (i) in connection with any funeral/Wedding.
    - (ii) in connection with any emergency maintenance operation in premises adjacent to the road.

(iii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic in or adjacent to the road.

(iv) the installation or carrying out of works to a traffic sign, road lighting or street furniture in or adjacent to the road.

4. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other enactment.

5. This Order shall come into operation on \*\*\*\*\* and may be cited as ‘The Essex County Council (Turnip Lodge Lane) (Tendring District) (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 202\*’
