Project Updates



HE/ECC Strategic Collaboration Board - Feedback

- DfT recognised the excellent relationship Essex has with the department and Highways England in securing schemes in the Road Investment Strategy (e.g. A120, M11 Junction 7a, and A12)
- DfT highlighted some concern with pursuing re-trunking for several reasons:
 - Future rounds of the MRN funding is potentially a more realistic form of funding prior to re-trunking
 - A single voice from South Essex needs to articulate what is required for the form and function of the A127 e.g. more accessibility (for development) or less accessibility (for strategic trips)
 - Potential to seek funding for development of the case
- DfT are currently reviewing the Road Investment Strategy Road Map and want to review the extent of Strategic Road Network in Essex and Kent given the introduction of the Lower Thames Crossing – so there is an opportunity to influence
- DfT want to connect urban conurbations (Basildon and Southend) and the Airport but further dialogue over the extent of trunking is needed e.g. which is the right route for strategic traffic – Further opportunity for the A13 or A127?
- Key Immediate Next Steps:

- Key messages briefing so advocates speak with 'one voice'
- Establishment of Business Board to harness support
- Correspondence and liaison with Transport East, DfT, HE, MPs and Ministers
- Communications activity (press releases, social media, newsletter content) to build momentum and keep story in the news
- Assist MPs with raising parliamentary questions
- Potential survey to demonstrate support for A127 aspirations
- Potential parliamentary reception to present case
