Colchester Rapid Transit System


- The Colchester Rapid Transit System (RTS) will see the creation of a new transport route linking key destinations across the town.
- What makes RTS unlike other public transport is that it will see high-frequency services, with various infrastructure and measures used along the route to provide segregation from or priority over other traffic.
- The scheme forms part of the £99.9m Housing Infrastructure Funding to support the new Tendring Colchester Borders Garden Community development (alongside the proposed new A120-A133 Link Road).



Colchester Rapid Transit System Routing

For the purpose of delivery, the RTS proposals have been split into four sections which were presented to the public in 2019:

- Section A covers from the existing A12 Park & Ride Site to the Albert Roundabout. This includes the existing planning permission for a 'segregated busway' adjacent to the Northern Approach Road;
- Section B covers from the Albert Roundabout to Greenstead Roundabout throughout the town centre;
- Section C covers from Greenstead Roundabout to the Garden Community.
- Section D covers the routing within the Garden Community itself and will evolve as the Masterplan develops.



RTS Section A – Planning Position

- When developing this part of town, the land to the immediate west of the Northern Approach Road was safeguarded as part of the original housing developments, with the intention of creating a rapid transit corridor in the future.
- Planning permission for the creation of a new 'segregated busway' along The Northern Approach Road was granted by Colchester Borough Council in 2006.
- ECC now plan to submit design details for this section of the route as part of the determination of the associated planning conditions.
- This will provide the public with the opportunity to comment on the detail following the submission to Colchester Borough Council expected to be within the next month.



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Section A Route





- From the Park & Ride site to the Mill Road there exists dedicated bus lanes for the length of Via Urbis Romanae;
- There is an existing bus gate at Bruff Close to deliver buses on North Station Roundabout;
- The proposed link is a missing piece of dedicated infrastructure to reduce public transport journey times and improve journey time reliability in northern Colchester.




Evaluation of proposals – 2021 (revised) vs 2012 (existing)


Western Side (Residential properties)






The above shows how in some locations there is upwards of 13.9m additional separation between the busway and residential properties.






Proposed Scheme (Dickenson Road to Wallace Road)

Summary

- Realignment of the proposed RTS corridor, from the previous submission, closer to the A134 and further away from residential properties with improved safety at junctions;
- The scheme creates large landscaped areas between the busway and properties, which are to be planted with sympathetic massed shrub and herbaceous groundcover. This robust planting scheme will promote the corridor's biodiversity and attract wildlife (with the introduction of pollinator-friendly native plant species, log-piles for hibernacula's, and the addition of bat and bird boxes);
- New landscaping comprising 6m nursery grown semi-mature trees. Despite proposing to remove existing avenue trees, it is
 proposed to replace them and increase the total number of trees by an additional third;
- We are looking to transplant the healthiest examples of existing avenue trees to Bruff Close area;
- Enhancement of Hospital and Bruff Close RTS stops through the creation of amenity space as well as a new direct pedestrian/cycle connection into the adjacent housing estate;
- A dedicated bi-directional 3m wide cycle track and 2m wide dedicated footway along corridor;

Timeline

- In the next month planning submission
- Opportunity to comment on proposals for 3 weeks
- Sign up to newsletter for notification on ECC website (on next slide).
- After submission determination period starts, of 8-13 weeks.
- Late 2021/Early 2022 Procure contractor
- Summer 2022 Construction starts
- Later Summer/Autumn 2023 Scheme opening
