## 4. Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Regarding minute 5, paragraph 5, the meeting with the Cabinet member for Highways had not yet taken place but would now be prioritised.

Regarding minute 8, paragraph 9, Cllr Lissimore had spoken to Cabinet Member for Highways several times about what would happen to schemes that had not reached the implementation stage, and they were aiming to set up a meeting to discuss further in the near future and develop a flow chart that could be circulated to members.

The Panel sought clarification about schemes which were in validation that were not included in the report. Highways Liaison Officer confirmed that these were no longer coming to the panel and Highways Liaison Team leader further explained that such schemes need to be fitted in around other schemes that were being commissioned and could be in a queue for some time. The Chair wanted to ensure that such schemes would be forwarded to the new Highway Authority\_following Local Government Reorganisation, and that the Panel had done everything it could to ensure funding.

The Panel requested clarity on what would happen if a scheme overran and was not completed during dissolution. Highways Liaison Team Leader confirmed that this was one of the reasons that all panels would have set 2-year rolling programmes, with plenty of contingency. Only schemes that could be delivered within the 2-year period should be commissioned, which meant that it would not be appropriate to commission design-only or feasibility studies. The Chair confirmed that she would discuss with the Cabinet Member for Highways the lack of continuity if the Panel did not have a pipeline of schemes to hand over to the new Highway Authority and would keep the Panel informed.

Regarding the resolution to minute 8, Highways Liaison Officer confirmed that the prioritised list of Schemes Awaiting Funding had been circulated to the Panel and reminded members that at the June meeting they had looked at all schemes that had been prioritised from P1-P5 and those schemes with priority P1-P4 had been added to the works programme. Schemes rated P5 remained for the Panel to discuss.



## 5. Report on Funded Schemes 2025/26 and 2026/27

The Panel considered a report which provided an update on the position of schemes which the Panel recommended for inclusion in its 2025/26 and 2026/27 programmes. Highways Liaison Officer confirmed that £208,780 remained available from the original budget of £750,000 and reiterated that the Cabinet Member for Highways has asked that no design-only or feasibility schemes be included, unless they could be delivered within two years. It was reported that:-

Scheme 33, Hythe Quay Pedestrian Crossing, was not deliverable within the timeframe and was therefore removed from the list.

Scheme 34, Chapel Corner, Wormingford Bus stop improvements, was a total scheme (with 32) and was deliverable so remained on the list.

The Panel agreed that Scheme 35, Footpath 5 off Tollgate Road, Stanway, should receive additional funding of £40,000 to turn it from a design-only scheme into a total scheme. Highway Liaison Officer would arrange for the project management team to agree a date for completion that would be shared at the next meeting.

# 6. Report on Schemes Awaiting Funding

The Panel considered a report setting out schemes awaiting funding, which had been prioritised as P5 at the June Meeting. Highways Liaison Officer confirmed that, following the discussion regarding funded schemes 2025/26 and 2026/27, £168,780 was available to be allocated.

In response to a query regarding the cost of lights for Walking scheme Meander Mews to Rouse Way, Highways Liaison Officer asked the panel member to contact him after the meeting as it was a design-only scheme and not for consideration by the panel. Clir Çufoğlu

Following extensive discussion by the Panel regarding disabled access at Wivenhoe station (Clifton Terrace scheme, which was not currently included in reports) it was suggested that a less expensive scheme could potentially be added to the list of schemes awaiting funding, if sufficient funds remained following allocation of remaining funds and pending further discussion between Cllr Cory and the Cabinet Member for Highways. Highways Liaison Team Leader reiterated that as it currently stood this scheme fell outside the remit of the Panel and

stressed that Panels were required to allocate money by end of September, to schemes that were deliverable within two years.

Given that special dispensation would be required from the Cabinet Member for Highways to proceed with a revised Clifton Terrace scheme, the panel reviewed options that could be delivered within two years from the list of schemes awaiting funding.

## **Traffic Management**

Of the eight schemes that were either total schemes or implementation, the Panel agreed that 4 (Swan Street - Gateway Improvements) and 6 (Argents Lane - Water depth markers) should be given funding, leaving a total of £137,750 for other schemes.

In addition, scheme 7 (Mersea Road j/w Stansted Road, improvements to mini roundabout) required more feedback from local residents, which Cllr Harris agreed to collect.

#### Walking

The Panel noted that implementation schemes 1 (Chappel Road, Great Tey, footway) and 2 (Maldon Road, Tiptree, new footway) were outside the budget, but agreed that they should be kept on the reserve list.

## Cycling

In respect of Scheme 1, improvements to Spring Lane Roundabout, the Panel agreed that major improvements were needed. However, whilst this would be a small contribution to making cycling a little safer, the roundabout was used by comparatively few cyclists and there was some doubt as to how the scheme would be welcomed by local cycling groups. The Panel therefore decided not to allocate any funds to the scheme.

#### Passenger transport

The Panel discussed items 1 (East Mersea Road, West Mersea) and 4 (A1124 Colchester Road) for the replacement of bus shelters which fell outside the remit of the Essex Wide Bus Shelter contract. It was agreed that item 1 should be funded. Item 4 would potentially be delivered more cheaply by the Parish Council, and discussion would be taken off-line.

It was noted that the Parish council no longer wanted item 2 (Spring Lane, Eight Ash Green) which could therefore be removed from the list.

## **Public rights of Wav**

The Panel considered the only potential total scheme proposal (Cambridge Road, Footpath 198) should not receive funding at that stage.



Highways Liaison Officer confirmed that there was an unallocated budget of £121,250. Cllr Cory proposed that this should be ringfenced for the Clifton Terrace scheme, which was agreed by the Panel. Highways Liaison Team Leader agreed to speak with engineers about what was possible. If the Clifton Terrace scheme was not feasible, the Panel would consider other options. Cllr Cory informed the panel that he had asked the Cabinet Member for Highways for a site visit.
