	Update from Dan MacLean – Highway Liaison Team Leader	
	Tom Cunningham, Essex County Council has provided an update on the status of Local Highway Panel and Local Government Reorganisation.	
	The Local Highway Panel will no longer exist in its current form after Local Government Reorganisation.	
	The budget for Castle Point Local Highways Panel has been allocated for the next two years and has been increased to cover large schemes for approval and implementation.	
	The budget for Castle Point is £343,200.	
	LHP to decide which schemes to fund over the next two years within their allocated budget. No new schemes are permitted to be submitted. Schemes in the validation stage will remain.	
	LHP to decide at this meeting today, which schemes to approve and remove.	
	Several members of the panel have raised queries on safety. Dan Maclean replied that the current cabinet will issue an announcement soon.	
	Dan Maclean advised that there could be extra funding for safety schemes. HLO explains there will be no new speed surveys under Castle Point LHP during this funding period. Cllr Egan says that police concentrating on speed limits around schools, rarely succeed and are expensive to be conducted. HLO confirms evidence shows most drivers are abiding by law and if percentage not high enough to warrant action. Dan Maclean refers the panel to the additional data on reports for more information. Drivers breaking the speeding limit is policing issue.

CASTLE POINT LOCAL HIGHWAY PANEL REPORT 2 - SCHEMES AWAITING FUNDING LIST

Following a review of the LHP process, the allocation of the LHP capital budget will be adjusted for the upcoming period. The Panel is requested to provide funding recommendations for a two-year rolling programme of work, for which a total funding of £343,200 has been agreed for the Castle Point LHP

Following the June 2025 Panel meeting, scheme funding recommendations to the value of £320,300 have been made. As such there remains £22,900 for the panel to make further scheme funding recommendations against.

Due to the associated abortive costs, only schemes that can be delivered by the end of the 2026/2027 financial year can be commissioned. As such the Panel are asked not to recommend funding towards Design Only or Feasibility Studies


