# Matters arising from Minutes of previous meeting. The HLO (Highway Liaison Officer) reminded the panel of the communication from the last LHP (Local Highways Panel) meeting where the HLTL (Highway liaison Team Leader) communicated on the future status of the LHP in relation to LGR (Local Government Reorganisation). The LHP are currently working on a two-year plan to deliver schemes that were agreed by the panel at the previous LHP meeting. Cllr Egan asked for clarification on the programme and what will happen with any remaining funds after this period. The HLO confirms that any funds that are not allocated to agreed listed schemes can be used elsewhere. Only schemes that are Total Schemes or Implementation Schemes can be delivered. HLTL reiterates that anything that is funded and not on the ground by the end of the two-year period will result in lost revenue costs. The panel must focus on the implementation of current schemes. Cllr Jones asked if there has been any insight since the last meeting into the LGR/proposed 5UAs and who would be responsible for highways. The HLO confirmed that they have not had any insight since the last LHP meeting.

## CASTLE POINT HIGHWAY PANEL REPORT 1 - FUNDED SCHEMES LIST

At the June Panel meeting Members were asked to recommend funding towards schemes they wish to see included in a two-year Rolling Programme of Works, covering 2025/26 and 2026/27. The Panel prioritised those schemes they wished to see included within the works programme. These prioritisations were then circulated to all Panel Members to gain agreement.

This report provides an update on the current position of all the schemes the panel has recommended for inclusion in their two-year Rolling Programme of Works.



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## 6. Report on Schemes Awaiting Funding – Report 2:

## CASTLE POINT LOCAL HIGHWAY PANEL REPORT 2 - SCHEMES AWAITING FUNDING LIST

Following a review of the LHP process, the allocation of the LHP capital budget will be adjusted for the upcoming period. The Panel is requested to provide funding recommendations for a two-year rolling programme of work, for which a total funding of £343,200 has been agreed for the Castle Point LHP.

Following the June 2025 Panel meeting, scheme funding recommendations to the value of £320,300 have been made. As such there remains £22,900 for the panel to make further scheme funding recommendations against.

Due to the associated abortive costs, only schemes that can be delivered by the end of the 2026/2027 financial year can be commissioned. As such the Panel are asked not to recommend funding towards Design Only or Feasibility Studies

The Chairman raised to proposal to fund the two schemes on page 13, Schemes Awaiting Funding, Walking. The panel agreed to fund two further schemes to be included in the two-year rolling programme.

LCAS233006 Canvey Road- Northwick Corner Roundabout – Barriers - £15,300 LCAS233007 A13 Kiln Road j/w Bradley Avenue – Bollards - £20,200

The HLO confirmed that any unallocated funds allows for a contingency.

Cllr Peter May would like to highlight the issues on Northwick Road where a new care home and raised a proposal for signage to be installed for safety purposes. Cllr May will share more information and photographs with HLO.





HLO referred to the scheme in which Cllr Blackwell's paid for wildlife signs out of CPBC funding. HLO will act and check signs with ECC and design engineer in relation to funds/compliance.

Chairman concludes the report.

## 7. Any Other Business:

Cllr Blackwell showed the LHP a short video in relation to a car accident relating to a stolen vehicle which crashed into a house causing significant damage to the property. Concerns are in relation to the location of the incident which is on a dangerous bend in the road and is causing a risk to life.

The house has encountered three major accidents in the last five years which has caused serious damage to the resident's home. The most recent incident resulted in three persons in the vehicle sustaining injuries.

Highways have been notified and the HLO has reported that there are no identified/evidential issues on this road.

The resident has written to their MP and Highways have referred them back to their local councillors. Cllr Blackwell has liaised with local police and has met at the location with ECC, Mark Redgwell who is investigating further.

The Chairmans understanding is that Safer Essex Roads Partnership Committee does not have funding available and advises that councillors are entitled to a surgery with Councillor Cunningham, ECC to address safety issues.

HLTL recommends escalation to the Casualty Reduction Team to address safety issues.

Cllr Blackwell raised concerns into VAS (Vehicle Activated Speed Signs) not working. The HLO confirmed that the VAS near Kingston school has recently been repaired.

Cllr Blackwell reported that two VAS signs near to Thorney Bay are currently not working which could be in relation to overhanging vegetation which may affect the solar charger.

Cllr Egan will investigate to have the vegetation cleared by ECC and CPBC Highway Rangers.

Cllr Jones appreciated that there are no addition funds for new schemes but wanted to raise the concerns from a resident in relation to the crossing on the High Road opposite Lloyds pharmacy which is quite dangerous. The Chairman suggests that CPBC can share on social media their graphics on road safety.
